Executive Summary

The **Blaxit Decision Engine** (BDE v.2) is a proprietary, anti-bias assessment and country-ranking engine engineered specifically for the global Black experience.

It blends quantitative analysis, weighted priorities, and lived diaspora insights to create personalized, evidence-based country recommendations for each client. The Engine Produces a Quantitative Score and a Qualitative Assessment for Each Country.


